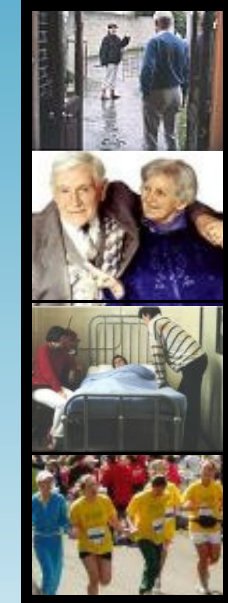


Our Work
